WHAT IS TITLE I?

Title I is a federally funded program that is a part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The goal of this law is to help all students meet grade level expectations as written in the Minnesota state standards. Our qualifying schools receive Title I funds, as well as state and local funds, to strengthen their academic programs and to accelerate the progress of all students

As a Title I funded school, we partner with families and staff to write goals and an action plan each year. Title I funds are used to help meet these goals.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS BROCHURE?

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT STRATEGIES

Our school is a Title I Schoolwide building that receives funding to support our students' academic needs. We have selected these goals to help all students:

- · Increased achievement in reading and math
- Implementation of Character Strong curriculum
- All staff will receive bi-monthly professional development on Catalyst Foundational Skills along with monthly coaching and feedback
- Engaging families in student learning

Progress on these school efforts will be reported to families through the "Hamilton Happenings" email after each trimester and at Monthly PTO meetings.

LITERACY AND MATH

Minnesota's English Language Arts (ELA) academic standards for reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills are taught daily in all elementary classrooms with the Amplify CKLA curriculum,





in K-3rd classrooms with Bridge2Read, and in 4th-5th grade classrooms with Functional Morphology. Students are taught core foundational skills of reading and writing through interesting fiction and nonfiction texts, while developing communication skills and confidence. Every student's progress is monitored regularly, and extra service is provided, as needed, by classroom teachers and support staff.

Minnesota's math academic standards are taught in all elementary classrooms. We use Bridges in Mathematics and the connected intervention program called Bridges Intervention. It addresses all the Minnesota math standards in a fun, engaging, and accessible way for all students. The program includes:

- Hands on activities for exploring, developing, testing, discussing, and applying math concepts
- Presentations of math concepts with language, pictures, and movement to meet the needs of all students
- Opportunities for students to solve math problems in many ways which helps students to build more flexible and efficient problem solving strategies
