
# What do I need to know about Morris Bye?

FASTBridge is a tool for K-3 screening assessments and progress monitoring.

#### FAST can:

- Screen students to determine intervention needs
- Help set goals
- Quickly and frequently monitor student progress
- Easily see growth compared to trend line data
- Help evaluate effectiveness of instruction and adjust as needed
  - Fast Early Reading descriptors

- Attend Family Nights



Title I is a federally funded program through the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

The purpose of these funds is to give all children in our school a fair, equitable, and significant opportunity to meet grade level expectations as written in the MN State Standards.

#### **READ** Act


#### The Minnesota Reading to Ensure Academic Development (READ) Act

The goal of this legislation is to have every Minnesota child reading at or above grade level every year, beginning in kindergarten...
