Our math curriculum is Bridges in Mathematics




Our comprehensive reading curriculum is Wonders.


How do Title I funds help our school?

Wilson's Title I Schoolwide Plan

School Improvement Strategy	Goal
Student Achievement in Reading	By the end of the 2024-25 school year, 47.9% of all students will score at or above grade level proficiency on the MCA reading assessments.
Student Achievement in Math	By the end of the 2024-25 school year, 60.9% of all students will score at or above grade level proficiency on the MCA math assessments.
Student Engagement	By the end of the 2024-2025 school year we will have 100% of classroom teachers directly teaching Character Strong lessons 5 times per week during morning meeting.
	By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, we will decrease the achievement gap (white vs SOC) in reading (gap 21%) and math (gap 26%) on the MCA assessment, while increasing proficiency overall.


