

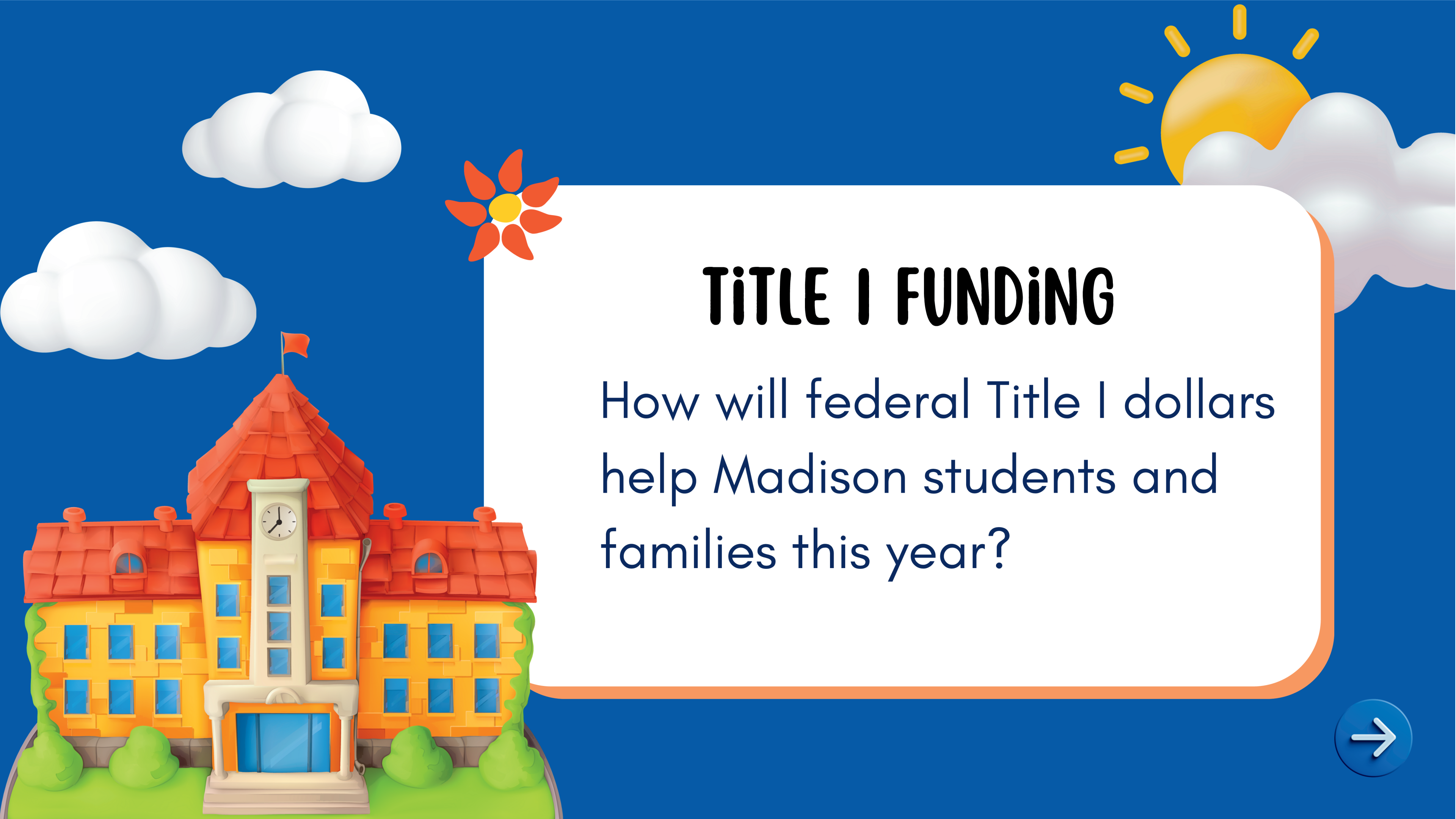

HOW ARE TITLE I FUNDS USED IN OUR DISTRICT?

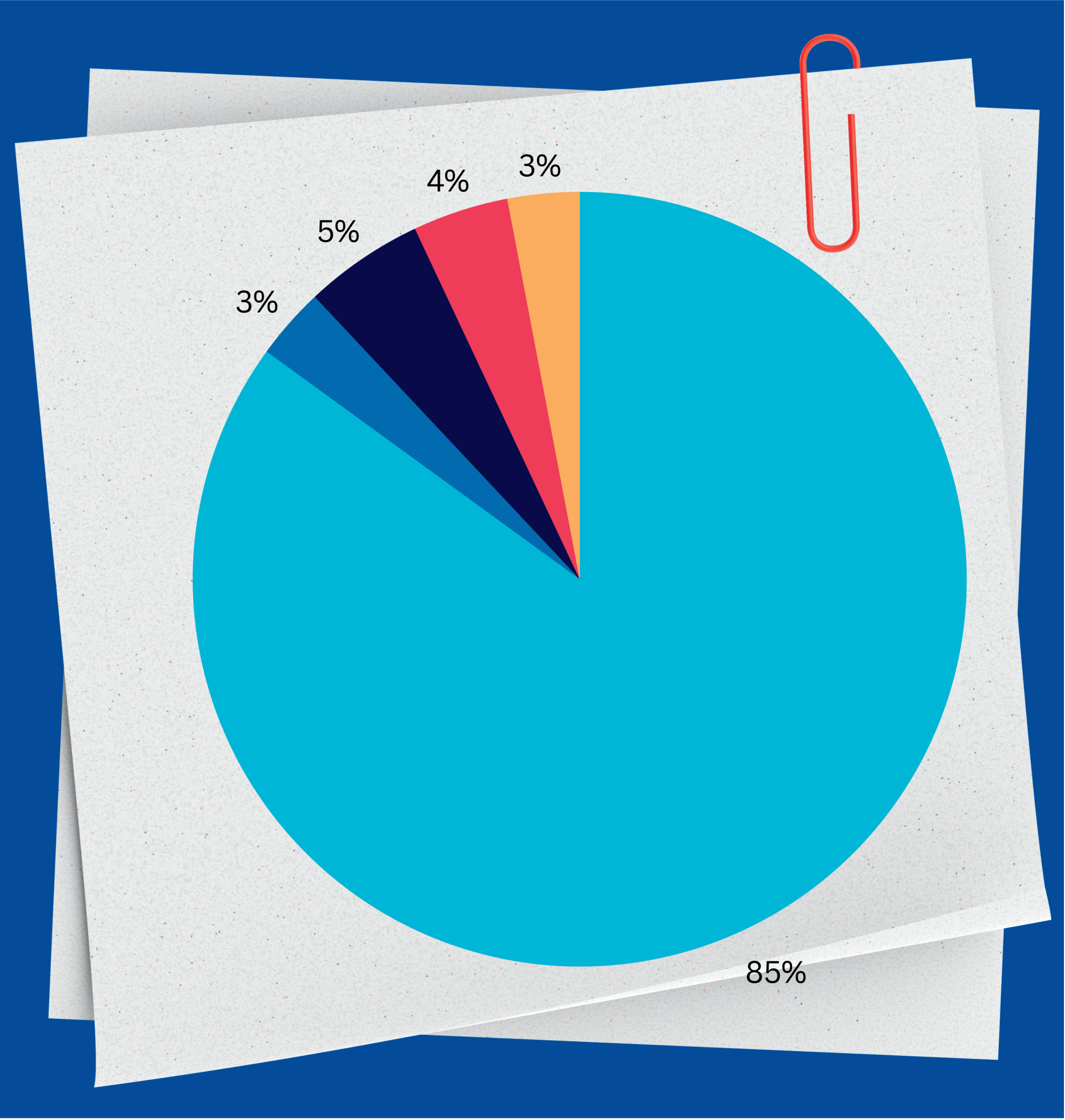

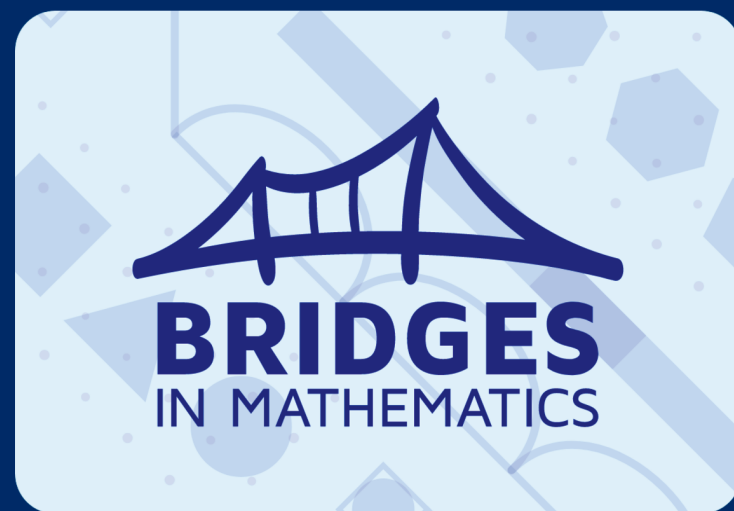
How will we help your child grow their reading, writing, speaking and math skills this year?

- Ample opportunities for students to practice reading, writing & speaking



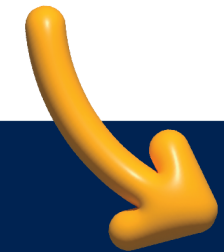
