

Helping at Home


In math, focus on **problem solving** rather than calculating.

- Help children get started and reflect on story problems
- Help children use visual representations
- Encourage using multiple problem-solving approaches

Play board games.

Have your child **read** at home *or* read out loud to your child every day.





How do Title I funds help our school?


Title I


