How does iTime work?



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1. Check for iTime emails from your teachers on Wednesday afternoon.

One of your teachers may **assign** you to their classroom during iTime for one of the following reasons:

- ➔ To reteach previously taught concepts.
- ➔ To personalize instruction to meet your learning style.
- → To participate in small group activities.

If you are assigned to a classroom you have been "Pinged" and must show

up.

Teachers & support staff may also **invite** you to attend seminars during iTime which you may:

- → Review concepts prior to a test.
- → Review assessments.
- → Participate in a study session.
- → Learn about college & career readiness.

These seminars are optional.

How does iTime work?



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2. Know your iTime options

If you **are not assigned to meet with a teacher,** <u>it means</u> <u>you have not been "Pinged"</u> and you are free to use your time in any of the following ways:

- → Stay with your current first hour teacher or connect with a current teacher to ask questions or make up missing work, quizzes, or tests.
- → Participate in a teacher or student led seminar that you were invited to attend (the invite would show up in your email).
- → Work on a group project.
- \rightarrow Complete a lab.
- \rightarrow Do homework or study for a test.

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3. Know your iTime approved locations

To connect with a current teacher or participate in a seminar:

→ The current teacher's classroom unless otherwise indicated.

For quiet independent study:

→ The IMC

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3. Know your iTime approved locations

To study independently or work on group projects:

- → Cafeteria
- → Main or North Commons
- → Social studies, science, or language arts resource centers.
